Statement of nature and significance of vegetation to be protected

The Calder Woodburn Memorial Avenue comprises over 2,400 Eucalyptus spp. trees along both sides of the Goulburn Valley Highway from south of Seven Creeks bridge to the Violet Town Road intersection at Moorilim. The avenue was planted by Arcadia farmer, J.F.L. Fenton Woodburn between 1945 and 1949 in honour of his son, Calder Woodburn, who was killed in action while serving with the RAAF in England. The memorial is also dedicated to district men and women who died in World War II and to all those who served. A number of the trees feature small metal nameplates at their base. The Avenue has been listed by the National Trust of Australia (Victoria) on its Register of Significant Trees.

The Avenue has local social and historical significance, but is most important for the scenic and landscape values established by the general uniformity of its planting and its consistent species.

Permit requirement

A permit is required for any development that is not in accordance with any management plan approved for the reserve by VicRoads, in conjunction with Heritage Victoria.

This does not apply to the removal, destruction, and lopping of vegetation which is in accordance with:

- the Calder Woodburn Memorial Avenue Conservation Management Plan prepared by John Patrick Pty Ltd August 2001;
- works undertaken in association with the construction of the Goulburn Valley Highway –
 Shepparton Bypass between Arcadia and Congupna as included in the Road Zone Category 1 and/or Public Acquisition Overlay (PAO7).
