VC37**Statement of nature and significance of vegetation to be protected**

Roadsides vegetation and wildlife corridors are a significant feature of the Mitchell Shire. Many roadsides and corridors throughout the area contain pockets of remnant indigenous vegetation, rare, vulnerable and significant flora species. Some of the roadsides and corridors provide a valuable source of native seed stock and important habitat for wildlife. The conservation and protection of these areas is an important strategy.

Protect and preserve indigenous vegetation and rare and endangered flora and fauna species on linear reserves

Achieve high landscape quality on roadsides

Maintain and enhance habitat and corridor requirements for indigenous fauna

A planning permit is not required to remove, destroy or lop any:

- Exotic vegetation.
- Vegetation to the minimum extent necessary to construct, use or maintain the Broadford Water Supply Project, in accordance with an approved Project Impact Assessment, environmental management plan and native vegetation offset plan.

C141mith**Decision guidelines**

The following decision guidelines apply to an application for a permit under Clause 42.02, in addition to those specified in Clause 42.02 and elsewhere in the scheme which must be considered, as appropriate, by the responsible authority:

- The conservation and enhancement of the area
- The preservation of, and impact on, the natural environment or landscape values
- The role of native vegetation in conserving the flora and fauna and in providing food, shade and shelter for native fauna
- The need to retain native vegetation if it is rare or supports rare species of flora or fauna and where it forms part of a wildlife corridor
- Whether provision is made or is to be made to establish and maintain native vegetation elsewhere on the land
- The sensitive location of driveways or crossings over roadside reserves
- The Mitchell Shire Roadside Conservation Surveys (1993-2002)
