TRUGANINA CEMETERY

1.0

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Statement of nature and significance of vegetation to be protected

A small remnant area of plains grassland dominated by *Stipa bigeniculata* and *Themeda triandra* but also supporting a variety of native grasses and containing a large and viable population of the Nationally endangered Button Wrinklewort (*Rutidosia leptorrhynchoidea*), once common in south-eastern Australia. The vulnerable Striped Legless Lizard (*Delma impar*) has been recorded in the Cemetery.

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Vegetation protection objective to be achieved

To ensure the long-term protection of native grasses, the nationally endangered Button Wrinklewort (*Rutidosia leptorrhynchoidea*) and associated fauna.

To prevent inappropriate development that is likely to prejudice the long-term protection of native grasses, the nationally endangered Button Wrinklewort (*Rutidosia leptorrhynchoidea*) and associated fauna.

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Permit requirement

A permit is not required to remove, destroy or lop any native vegetation undertaken:

- to dig or maintain a grave.
- by or on behalf of the land manager intended to maintain or improve the Cemetery's significance as a flora and fauna conservation site.
